Essay titled *Booth's First Attempt*. In it, Katz speculates that John Wilkes Booth first made an attempt on Abraham Lincoln's life at his second Inaugural speech on 4 March 1865. Katz narrates a story in which Booth violently tries to break through the security barrier and engages in a physical confrontation with John W. Westfall, a member of the Capital police force.
