Markham, born in 1852, was a fairly famous American poet. He is most famous for his poem, *The Man with the Hoe,* which was published and publicly read in 1898. He also published a poem entitled, *Lincoln, the Man of the People*. His style was dated, however, and his work received a great deal of criticism; thus being slightly overshadowed by other literary figures of the time. He came to Gettysburg and delivered a lecture on composing poetry in November 1925. He died in March of 1940.
