

## CW/VFM-78: J. (Judah) Touro Robertson

Diary, 1861, written while serving in Co. D., 12th Regiment New York State Militia

The regiment was formed originally as the 11<sup>th</sup> Regiment under the command of General Butterfield. It left New York City for Washington, D.C., where it was mustered in for three months service in early May of 1861. It was mustered out at New York City in early August of 1861. Many of its members entered the 12<sup>th</sup> Militia, which was consolidated into the 12<sup>th</sup> Volunteers. It was surrendered with Harper's Ferry. It was mustered out at New York City on October 8<sup>th</sup>, 1862 and exchanged on January 11<sup>th</sup>, 1863. June 20<sup>th</sup>, 1863, the regiment moved to Harrisburg. It was mustered out for the final time on July 20<sup>th</sup>, 1863.

The regiment was engaged in the siege and surrender of Harper's Ferry (9/12-15/1862).

## Diary of Robertson:

Key entries in this document include:

July 22<sup>nd</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup>, 1861-captured a rebel captain in Harper's Ferry.

While there is not any mention of skirmishing, this presents a very detailed account of camp life among the US Regular Troops at the beginning of the war.
