Documents Urging the Erection of a Monument to John Sedgwick

Member of the veteran association of Shaler's Brigade, Sixth Army Corps, recording their feelings of a lack of a monument to their corps commander, Maj. Gen. John Sedgewick As of August 1906, Major-General John Sedgwick did not have a monument at Gettysburg. Shaler's Brigade (65th, 67th, and 122nd New York; 23rd and 82nd Pennsylvania) of the Sixth Army Corps wrote a petition to the state legislature of Connecticut to have this rectified on August 10, 1906. Shaler's Brigade was the one group within the Sixth Army Corps that was not held in reserve at Gettysburg.
