The community of the day felt that Key deserved to be shot for engaging in adultery, and were in full support of Sickles' acquittal. They were more scandalized by the fact that he forgave his wife for her betrayal.

## The Hagerstown Mail: March 20, 1857 (this is in 2 pieces)

This document lays out the details of the trial and decision in the Supreme Court over the constitutionality of the Missouri Compromise line. Dred Scott attempted to sue for his freedom because his owner had taken him and his family into free territory. As far as he was concerned, that meant they were all free. The Supreme Court, particularly Roger Taney, ruled against him; he claimed that since Scott was not a citizen, he had no right to bring his grievances to court.
