

CW/VFM-106: Edward Woodward

Woodward is described as an "eccentric" Civil War veteran by Stanley Billheimer, a man who had the privilege of knowing him during his time at Gettysburg College. He wrote poetry, and two of his poems are contained in the file.

Untitled:

This poem deals with the importance of Memorial Day to Civil War veterans. He specifically mentions the battle of Gettysburg, which he was present at and cared for the wounded during the aftermath.

This poem deals with the Fall, and how Eve should not be blamed for her sin. He argues that she should be revered as good, gentle, full of wisdom, and intelligent.
