The Pennsylvania Bucktails, also known as the 1st Pennsylvania Rifles and the 42nd Pennsylvania Infantry, was organized in mid June of 1861 and was involved in almost every major engagement up to it's mustering out in May 1864. This regiment was comprised of eleven companies; the Anderson Rifle Guards (Co. A), the Morgan Rifles (Co. B), the Cameron Rifles (Co. C), the Raftsman's Guards (Co. D), the Tioga Rifles (Co. E), the Irish Infantry (Co. F), the Elk Rifles (Co. G), The Wayne Independent Rifles (Co. H), the McKean Rifles (Co. I), and the Raftsman's Rangers (Co. K). This regiment was outfitted with rifles upon special request to the governor because most of the men were backwoodsmen and accustomed to the rifle.
