

## CWVFM-141: Memorial Ribbon Worn at Abraham Lincoln's Funeral

This item is a woven ribbon, bearing the words, "We Mourn the Nation's Loss, Abraham Lincoln. April 15, 1865." The ribbon was worn by an attendee of one of the twelve train stops of the Lincoln Funeral Train.
