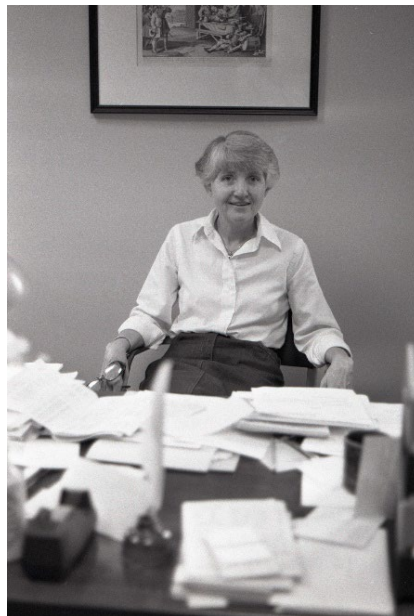

This collection is made up of multiple accessions some of which were gifts from Mary Margaret Stewart and others from her estate.

Biographical Note

Dr. Mary Margaret Stewart was born on August 4th, 1931 in Santa Monica, California, but grew up in Omaha Nebraska, and Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. She got her Bachelor's Degree from Monmouth College, Illinois, and completed her graduate studies in at Indiana University for a PhD in English Literature in 1959. Later that year, she began her career at Gettysburg College as a professor in the English Department. Dr. Stewart remained at Gettysburg College for her entire career as a beloved professor and in other administrative roles. As is reflected in her collection, she was passionate about implementing women's studies into the college curriculum and creating more diversity within the English department. Outside of her professional work, she also took part in the Land Conservancy of Adams County and was a member of the National Organization of Women (NOW). She was an avid art collector, and much of her collection was donated to the Gettysburg College Fine Art Collection or Musselman Library. Dr. Stewart focused her life's research on authors like William Collins and James Boswell, conducting years of research across in the United States and Europe. Also during her time at Gettysburg College, she helped construct *The Gettysburg Review*. Dr. Stewart retired in 1996. She passed away on October 10, 2021 in Canandaigua, N.Y. Revered by many, Dr. Mary Margaret Stewart's impact on Gettysburg College is everlasting in those whose lives she touched directly as a professor, and indirectly in her academic legacy.

Scope and Content Note

This collection contains a surplus of documents and objects that pertain to almost all aspects of Dr. Mary Margaret Stewart's life in her research, professional, publishing, and personal life. There are eight individual boxes of her research, mostly on loose-leaf paper, from a wide range of sources. Most of the research in this collection pertains to eighteenth-century poetry, notably the works of William Collins. There is also research into important figures like Sir Charles Hanbury Williams, Henry Fielding, James Boswell, and more. In this series, there are multiple boxes of notecards of different sizes that also contain research. While her art collection has not been grouped in this collection, there is also research

about some artists that she may have been interested in collecting. This series contains her research correspondence with various libraries and resources that have helped her in her work. The professional and publishing materials consist of grade books (currently closed to researchers) and other teaching materials from throughout her career. This series also has offprints of her writings from journals in which they were published, which live in another box. Her professional and scholarship correspondence can also be found in this series, namely correspondence with journal editors and other faculty members. Her regalia is also in this collection. For personal effects, the rest of the boxes contain her personal correspondence and other work she did in advocacy outside of her professional life. Notably, folders from the 1970 National Women's Organization containing most all of the original materials, as well as the work she did for the Land Conservancy of Adams County. Finally, a box contains notecards that catalog her personal library.
